



Perth's premier garden and outdoor living expo has a new home

The Perth Garden Show, formerly known as the Perth Garden and Outdoor Living Festival, will return in 2025 with a new name, fresh branding, and a new venue.

Owned by the Nursery and Garden Industry WA (NGIWA), the 2025 event will be proudly presented in partnership with Water Corporation. It will be held from 2–4 May at its new home, McCallum Park in Victoria Park—a move warmly welcomed by members and participants alike, who agree it's an ideal setting for an event of this kind. NGIWA chairperson Ross Hooper said he is excited about the re-launch of the event, saying he is looking forward to putting on a bigger and better event in 2025.

"The Perth Garden Show presented by Water Corporation is the Nursery and Garden Industry of WA's flagship event for the year showcasing inspiring displays and products. For over 50 years the event has been promoting and supporting the gardening community and all the benefits to health and well-being there is with this connection to nature," Ross said.

"NGIWA is excited that the event is moving back to McCallum Park, and we feel this is a beautiful home for the event in an attractive natural setting with views across the Swan River to Perth City."

"At the event you will see people from all different trades coming together for a common cause. From inspiring speakers to experienced landscapers, and all the products to make gardeners successful in looking after this land we are on."

"2025 is going to be an exciting event as we look to grow this show bigger and better each year offering more to each person who attends," Ross said.

Think climate change, be waterwise!

Water Corporation has partnered with NGIWA for over 20 years to deliver waterwise programs in the garden industry, so partnering for the Perth Garden Show was a natural next step.

Water Corporation's Demand Delivery Manager, Damien Postma, said waterwise and gardening went hand in hand, providing benefits to biodiversity, urban cooling and the health and wellbeing of communities.

"Water Corporation is thrilled to have waterwise front and centre as part of this year's Perth Garden Show," Damien said.





"When the garden show launched about 50 years ago, most of the water supplied to Perth fell from the sky. Since then, there has been a 15-20 per cent reduction in rainfall, leading to an 80 per cent reduction in streamflow into Perth dams."

"While new water sources such as desalination and groundwater replenishment have helped to keep water from taps flowing, they can only produce so much and with such little rainfall in recent years, water is becoming more and more scare."

"Greenspaces are key to our city's liveability, and so is responsible water use. We're looking forward to being involved in WA's premier garden event and challenging the WA gardening community to do both – creating amazing waterwise Perth gardens."

The Perth Garden Show presented by Water Corporation is being re-launched in 2025 at a new location McCallum Park in Victoria Park. The location lends itself perfectly to this style of event, with free parking and accessible public transport, plus plenty of space for displays within the grassed, tree-lined park overlooking the Swan River.

The Perth Garden Show presented by Water Corporation includes an exciting mixture of retail displays from products and services with exciting and interactive activations for Show visitors to enjoy. The event is presented by major brands and agencies including Baileys, RichGro, Water Corporation and Department of Primary Industry and Regional Development; and is supported by the Nursery and Garden Industry WA (NGIWA), the Landscape Design Industry and Landscape Industry Association WA.

prominent landscape designers. Having worked in Australia and internationally for the past 17 years he is passionate about beautiful gardens and loves plants and the outdoors. His objective is to create stunning gardens that are timeless, inspiring and enjoyable to spend time in. Charlie will be at the Show all weekend speaking on stage within the RichGro Knowledge Centre as well as within the Show Gardens area.

Sabrina Hahn is a master gardener, horticultural professional, award-winning radio presenter and writer. She has passion for the creation of sustainable landscapes that make cities more liveable. Sabrina has shared her knowledge and passion for green spaces on ABC radio for 30 years, being one of the earliest pioneers to promote sustainable gardening practices in the media. She is a highly entertaining public speaker, and MC, she writes a twice-weekly gardening column in The West Australian, and also contributes articles for Gardening Australia and Organic Gardener. Show Gardens

Get inspired and see some awesome designs in the Show Garden displays. Show Gardens are designed to showcase planting skills, design knowledge, and horticultural expertise, and encourages creative themes that incorporate wildlife-friendly gardens and waterwise planting. Pocket gardens and "Achievable Gardens" will be on display at the Show.

Reticulation and Lawn Workshops

The Perth Garden Show presented by Water Corporation aims to equip visitors with products, knowledge and information on different aspects of gardening. The Lawn and Reticulation Workshops will serve to educate visitors on the different types of lawns available, which lawns will suit their homes, and how to properly reticulate them. We will have a special area set up within the Show that is dedicated to lawns and reticulation and will include a small presentation area where speakers can present to crowds. The area will also have displays of lawns and experts on hand to talk about them, as well as demonstrations on different types of reticulation.

Water Corporation has engaged the expert gardening and sustainable building team from The Forever Project to deliver three Blank Canvas Makeovers over the three days of the Perth Garden Show presented by Water Corporation, demonstrating the impact a waterwise garden can make to your home. After earning the title of Best Garden at the 2023 Perth Garden Show, The Forever Project team are excited to return in 2025, aiming to make an even greater impact with your support. Together, we can inspire and educate thousands on the importance of sustainable living and the role battery storage PV can play in this practice.

Narrated by some of the state's leading gardening and sustainability celebrity icons and combining the skills of our landscape team, this will be a fast paced and engaging 30-45min interactive garden performance. A fusion of entertainment and environmental education where audiences will see a tired patch of WA sand transformed into a beautiful waterwise garden, showcasing the vital role of gardens in our hot and drying climate.





At the conclusion of each performance, audiences will receive product information as well as 'show special' sign up offers. Each interactive garden performance will be done 3 times per day (9 in total) (9 in total) and will be finished off with the sustainable building and energy talk and demonstration.

Each day will introduce a new waterwise garden theme - The Waterwise Garden, The Firewise Garden etc. The finished garden will remain in situ so visitors to the Show the following day can view it. One presentation each day will be filmed and edited into a short video that will then be played in a loop on an LED screen positioned beside the displayed garden. Recipe Sheets for the previous days presentation will be available that will include a link to You Tube featuring a full version of the Blank Canvas Makeover.
