An immersive journey through consciousness at Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne!

What do a cognitive neuroscientist, a dharma teacher, a standup comedian, an 88-year-old woman with Alzheimer's, a teenager or two, a brain injury survivor, a group of running children, and several walking meditators have in common? They are all experts of the present moment, colliding at the World Premiere of Speed Dating with Cacti, a fun, immersive 2025 Melbourne Fringe Festival experience at Royal Botanic

Gardens Melbourne.

This spring, Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne invites audiences to take part in *Speed Dating with Cacti* — an immersive, mind-expanding experience that explores the slippery space between science and spirituality. Part theatre, part walking tour, and wholly unexpected, the investigation begins with the question of plant intelligence and ends with the thrilling acceptance of the exciting fact that, in all likelihood, humans will eventually face extinction.

Created by the internationally renowned Canadian performance company Mammalian Diving Reflex, this guided journey leads participants through a series of thought-provoking encounters, meditations, contemplations and demonstrations. Audience members pass from person to person, place to place, idea to idea, engaging with diverse perspectives that invite audiences to explore various models for thinking about consciousness and the true nature of reality.

"At the Gardens, we believe in stories that engage people through respectful, challenging and relevant storytelling that reminds us of our place in nature," said Emer Harrington, Executive Director Experience and Engagement Royal Botanic Gardens Victoria. "Year-round creative and cultural events, exhibitions, talks, interpretation and wellbeing and learning programs are informed by principles of vibrancy, social inclusion and respect for First peoples' knowledge systems. *Speed Dating with Cacti*, an extraordinary immersive experience, brings together people of all ages and backgrounds – from a cognitive neuroscientist to teenagers, children to those affected by Alzheimer's – in conversation with the living world around us."

Known for critically acclaimed works such as *Haircuts by Children* and *All the Sex I've Ever Had,* Mammalian Diving Reflex brings its trademark blend of irreverence and insight to the 2025 Melbourne Fringe Festival.

"Speed Dating with Cacti is a playful invitation to consider consciousness and to embrace both the bizarreness and beauty of being sentient," said Director Darren O'Donnell from Mammalian Diving Reflex. "Audiences will be gently invited to step out of the everyday and enter a theatrical, philosophical, speculative and sensory adventure that is as enlightening as it is entertaining as it is engulfing."
